This year's theme, "*Todos Somos, Somos, Uno: We are All, We are One,*" acknowledges the differences each group brings to the table and encourages communities to stand together as one community despite our differences. September is also Emergency Preparedness Month! Let us make sure that we are equipped with the knowledge and information to know what to do. The San Mateo County Emergency System also known as SMCReady is a hub for emergency preparedness. You'll find information about what to do in an emergency, simple steps to get connected, and useful guides to help you get prepared. For up-to-date information on emergency incidents as they happen, sign up for SMC Alert, the County's alert notification system used to immediately notify residents during urgent or emergency situations. Alerts may be sent via text and voice messages to email accounts, cell phones, tablets, and voice messages to landline phones. SMC Alert is available in all cities and towns in San Mateo County. Tomorrow, please join me and my colleague, Councilmember Coleman, to discuss the child care needs in our city. We especially want to hear from parents, guardians, child care providers, Early Childhood Education staff, and child care advocates on your needs and concerns in accessing and using child care in our city. On September 11th, the City of San Mateo hosted a regional community meeting to discuss prevalent cybercrimes that target Asian American and Pacific Islanders (AAPI), including pig butchering (where fraudsters use a fake

identity and gather information on social media to gain trust and solicit money), ransomware, and business email compromise (where fraudsters compromise a network and send emails posing as business representatives to redirect payments to the fraudster's bank accounts). Representatives from The Asian American Foundation, the San Mateo Police Department, San Mateo County District Attorney, the Department of Justice, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation shared data on the impact of cybercrimes, recommendations of how to mitigate becoming a victim, and valuable online resources to share with the South San Francisco community.

Preventative measures for these prevalent cybercrimes include:

Pig Butchering

- Do not talk about personal finances with strangers.
- Never send money to someone you met online.
- Do not provide personal information to anyone online or to a website you do not know is legitimate.
- If it sounds too good to be true, it is a scam.
- Be cautious of the information you post on social media only share with friends and family. This information is used by criminals to appear that they know you.

Ransomware

- Do not click on links or open attachments from unexpected messages or text messages.
- Back up your data with online and offline copies.
- Install critical software patches.
- Use anti-virus software.

Business Email Compromise (BEC)

- Use multi-factor authentication.
- Limit information on social media.

If you become a victim of BEC, the Financial Fraud Kill Chain Request steps are noted below:

- 1. Contact your financial institution *immediately*.
- 2. File a complaint with <u>ic3.gov</u>.
- Contact US federal law enforcement.
