

Get Air Quality Data





As our area begins to be impacted by wildfire smoke from fires burning in Northern California, here are some safety tips to protect yourself:

- Check Air Quality Index (AQI): Stay informed about local air quality by using apps or websites.
- Limit Outdoor Activities: Reduce strenuous outdoor activities when air quality is poor.
- Use Air Purifiers: Keep indoor air clean by using air purifiers with HEPA filters.
- Close Windows and Doors: Keep your home sealed to prevent outside air from coming in.
