What's going on with the former Burger King?





The City has received an application for an In-n-Out Burger fast food restaurant at 972 El Camino Real, submitted by the Kaidence Group. The proposal is to redevelop the existing Burger King restaurant with a new In-n-Out Burger with a landscaped patio area, and drive-through facility. The project application requires a Conditional Use Permit for a drive-through, and for expanded hours of operations. Staff is currently reviewing the project for completeness, and consistency with zoning standards. Visit our Construction page for updates.

Project Spotlight: Street Surface Seal Project Project Manager: Angel Torres, PE

What is Surface (

Surface seal is a protective treatment applied to roads to help extend their lifespan. It involves placing a thin layer of sealant on top of the existing road surface, which has already been crack-sealed and pretreated. This sealant acts as a barrier protecting the road from damage. Additionally, it improves the road's appearance. Think of it like sunscreen for your roads!

Street Sweeping Suspension
Suspended Services: Regular street sweeping will be officially reopened. temporarily suspended to allow the surface seal to dry properly.

Contractor Sweeping: Contractors will perform sweeping to remove loose gravel twice over a few days.

Schedule for Restriping

Timing: Restriping will occur after the surface seal has adequately dried and initial sweeping is complete.
