The Tailor and the Beast starts as a familiar fairy tale, with a beauty (Lucia) and a beast, but quickly takes a turn when Lucia's father, Andrea, a tailor deep in debt, offers himself in exchange for her freedom. The Beast agreeing to this request, leaves Andrea to spend his days walking the grounds and the castle's many empty rooms as he navigates his newfound confinement and isolation.

The Tailor and the Beast is a story of human connection between two very different people who are both kept from the outside world.

WRITE IT DOWN! DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Andrea often thinks about the cruelty of the curse and what it must have be like for the Beast. Why do you think Andrea has so much empathy for the Beast?

Andrea starts to suspect he can ask for his freedom at any time, yet he doesn't. Why?



What does the author mean by this sentence?
"But it seemed the rules in this enchanted castle were different, even the rules that governed his own heart"

Why does the Beast bring Andrea in from the cold and care for him?

Why would Andrea test the Beast by being disruptive? Do you think he considered the possible consequences? At this point in the story, do you think Andrea suspects the Beast won't harm him?

In the capitol and in the village, Andrea could only work when he was inspired, often leaving projects unfinished. What changed for Andrea, allowing him to tailor a coat for the Beast?

Though released from his curse, the Beast still believes he is a monster for holding Andrea against his will. Andrea assures the Beast he isn't because he never harmed him. Do you think Andrea forgave too quickly even if he loves him? If you were Andrea, what would you do?
